Important Travel Information to Qambathi Mountain Lodge

Note: The roads to Qambathi are not suitable for sports cars or vehicles with low clearance. If you're uncertain about your route, please don't hesitate to give us a call.

From Durban via the Kamberg Road:

This route has significant potholes and extensive roadworks.

- 1. Travel northbound on the N3 and take the Nottingham Road off-ramp (Exit 132).
- 2. Turn right and head towards Nottingham Road village.
- 3. Continue through the village, keeping right under the railway bridge, and proceed towards Rosetta (R103), which is 8km away.
- 4. In Rosetta, turn left onto the Kamberg Rock Art Centre Road and continue for 29.2km.
- 5. Turn left onto Mpofana Road, signposted Kamberg Rock Art Centre and Qambathi.
- 6. After 2km on the dirt road, you'll find Qambathi on your right.

From Durban via Lower Lotheni:

Most of this route is on new tar, but the last 15km is a mostly good gravel track. It's passable for most vehicles, but during the wet summer months, we recommend a high-clearance vehicle.

- 1. Take the N3 and turn off at the Nottingham Road off-ramp (Exit 132).
- 2. Continue into Nottingham Road village, passing under the railway bridge.
- 3. Proceed through Nottingham Road on the R103 for approximately 1.2km, then turn left onto the Lower Lotheni Road at the Nottingham Road Police Station.
- 4. Travel along this road for approximately 28km until you see signs for Kamberg.
- 5. Turn right onto the dirt road.
- 6. Continue along this road for approximately 13.3km (you'll pass through two gates marked "Maloti Drakensberg World Heritage Site"; the road will briefly change to tar before returning to dirt).
- 7. After 13.3km, turn right at the T-junction, cross the Mooi River bridge, and continue up the hill until you reach Qambathi Mountain Lodge on your left, just before the Kamberg Road.

Alternative Routes:

If you're coming from the Northern parts of the Drakensberg, including Estcourt and Mooi River, several routes are available. These routes consist of a mix of tar roads (with many potholes) and dirt tracks. We recommend a high-clearance vehicle.
