Important Travel Information to Qambathi Mountain Lodge

Please Note: The roads to Qambathi are not suitable for sports cars or vehicles with very low clearance. If you're unsure about your route, please don't hesitate to give us a call.

From Johannesburg via the Kamberg Road:

This route has significant potholes and roadworks.

- 1. Take the N3.
- 2. At the MAIN Mooi River Toll (Mooi River South Greytown), take the far left lane.
- 3. Turn right, crossing over the highway until you reach a T-junction (you'll see an Engen Garage and Wimpy ahead).
- 4. Keep right under the railway bridge and continue through the village towards Rosetta (R103), 8km away.
- 5. At Rosetta, turn left onto the Kamberg Rock Art Centre Road and travel 29.2km.
- 6. Turn left onto Mpofana Road, signposted Kamberg Rock Art Centre and Qambathi.
- 7. Continue for 2km along the dirt road; Qambathi will be on your right.

From Johannesburg via Lower Lotheni:

Most of this route is on new tar, but the last 15km is a mostly good gravel track. This route is passable in most vehicles, though during the wet summer months, a high-clearance vehicle is recommended.

- 1. Take the N3.
- 2. At the MAIN Mooi River Toll (Mooi River South Greytown), take the far left lane.
- 3. Turn right, crossing over the highway until you reach a T-junction (you'll see an Engen Garage and Wimpy ahead).
- 4. Turn left onto the R103 and travel 16.4km south to Nottingham Road.
- 5. In Nottingham Road, turn right onto the Lower Lotheni Road (the Nottingham Road Police Station will be on your right).
- 6. Travel approximately 28km until you see the signs for Kamberg.
- 7. Turn right onto the dirt road and continue for approximately 13.3km (you'll pass through two gates marked "Maloti Drakensberg World Heritage Site" and the road will briefly change to tar before returning to dirt).
- 8. After 13.3km, turn right at the T-junction, cross the Mooi River bridge, and continue up the hill until you reach Qambathi Mountain Lodge on your left, just before the road turns to tar.

Alternative Routes:

If you're coming from the Northern parts of the Drakensberg, including Estcourt and Mooi River, there are several routes available. These include a mix of tar roads (with many potholes) and dirt tracks. We recommend a high-clearance vehicle.
